



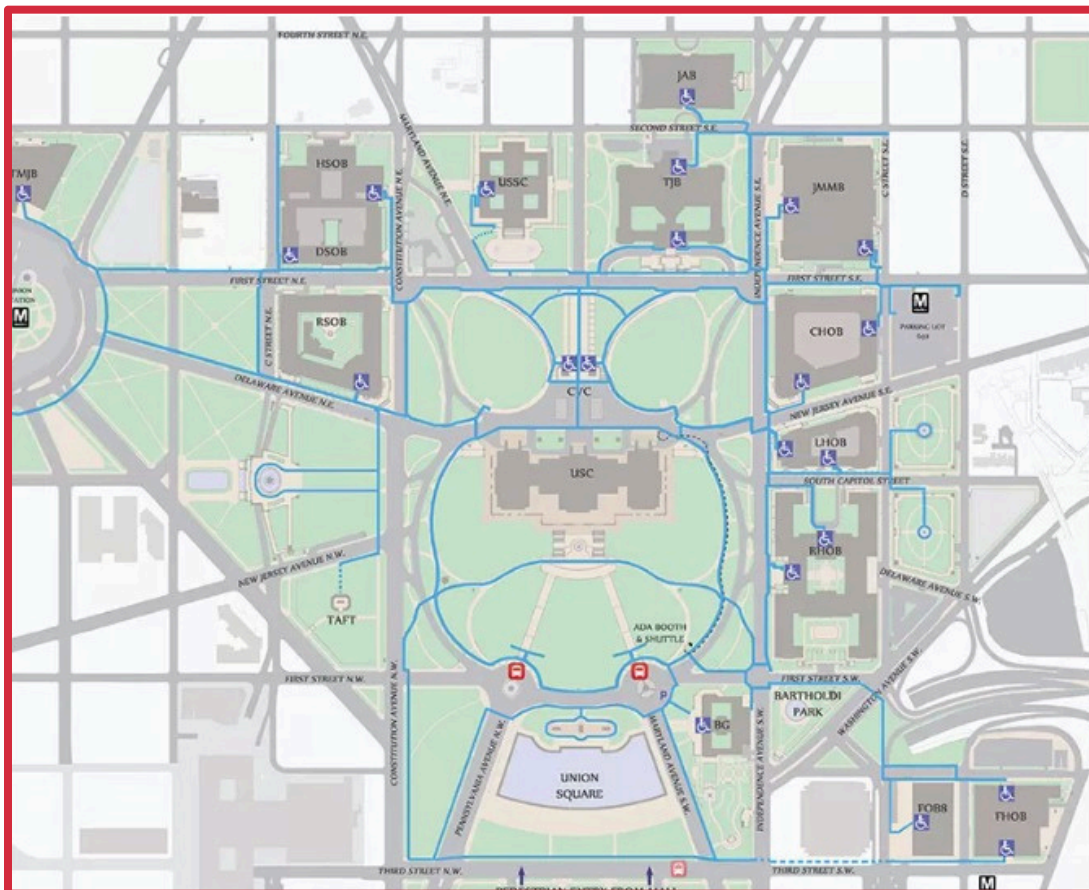
Accessibility on Capitol Hill

SHUTTLE SERVICE

For your convenience, the Capitol Visitor Center provides an on-demand shuttle service. The shuttles run from the bus drop-off and pick-up areas on the west side of the Capitol to the Capitol Visitor Center entrance. They operate as needed Monday - Saturday from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Visitor Center staff in the kiosks can provide additional information and call a shuttle if needed. The west side kiosk is located near Independence Avenue and First Street SW, across from the U.S. Botanic Garden. The east side kiosk is located near East Capitol Street NE/SE and First Street NE/SE, across the street from the U.S. Supreme Court and the Library of Congress Jefferson Building.

ACCESSIBLE PATHWAYS AND ENTRANCES (LIST)

House Building Accessible Entrances

- Cannon House Office Building: Enter on C Street, SE, west of the First Street
- Ford House Office Building: Entrance on 3rd Street, SW. Or 2nd Street, SW.
- Longworth House Office Building: Main entrance, Independence and New Jersey Ave.
- Rayburn House Office Building: Horseshoe drive off South Capitol Street or entrance on Independence Avenue.

Senate Building Accessible Entrances

- Dirksen Senate Office Building: First and C Street entrance.
- Hart Senate Office Building: Second Street entrance or Constitution Avenue.
- Russell Senate Office Building: Delaware entrance on ground level closest to Constitution Avenue.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

Public parking is very limited around Capitol Hill. The closest public parking facility is Union Station. The District of Columbia does recognize accessible parking permits issued by the states and territories. Parking is permitted at designated accessible spaces or any metered/un-metered parking space (no fee required), within the hours allowed for general parking in that area.

Visitors must display state-issued accessible tags or permits.
