

EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING AND ADAPTIVE BEHAVIOR IN YOUTH WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY

A remote research study through the CO-IND International Collaboration

What is the study about?

The goal of this study is to understand how **executive functioning skills**, such as working memory and inhibition, are related to **everyday adaptive behaviors** in youth with intellectual disability. The study aims to improve understanding and practical support in daily life.

What does the study involve?

- **Two** remote meetings via **Zoom of 1.5h** each (3h total)
- **Computer-based tasks and questionnaires** for youth
- **Caregiver questionnaires** about their child's everyday skills

Who can Participate?

- Youth **ages 6-21**
- **Diagnosed with intellectual disability**
- Caregiver available to participate
