A Study About Brain Health and Aging



As adults with Down syndrome get older, some develop memory problems linked to Alzheimer's disease, but many do not. This research study wants to learn **why** and to find **early signs of brain changes** related to Alzheimer's.

Who Can Join?



Adults with Down syndrome, **aged 20 or older**

What Will Participants Do?



Memory and thinking activities, questionnaires



Have a family member or caregiver answering questions

Optional: give a blood sample, have brain scans, or physical exams

(Activities are available in English, Spanish, and Portuguese)
